### A National Level 8 Day Quality Improvement Programme (QIP) "NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020: India's Education 4.0 Futuristic Growth"

#### **REPORT OF THE EVENT**

Good evening to one and all ,I consider myself very fortunate that I have got the opportunity to present a brief report on the National Level 8 day (QIP) on National Education Policy 2020:India's Education 4.0 for Futuristic Growth organized by IQAC of Renuka College under the auspices of Research Foundation of India in Collaboration with the IQACs of Yashoda Girls' Arts & Commerce College, Manoharrao Kamdi Mahavidyalaya ,DayanandAryaKanyaMahavidyalaya and Women's College of Arts and Commerce, Nagpur. The QIP has drawn **194 digital participants** from different corners of India. The inaugural of the QIP was held on 11<sup>th</sup> July 2021 with the introductory remarks by Dr.JyotiPatil Ma'am-Principal ,Renuka College Besa,Nagpur who outlined the aims and objectives of the QIP on NEP 2020 and the rationale behind organizing the QIP.She put forth the road map of the 8 days programme and made the digital participants aware of theluminaries of erudite speakers of the forthcoming days .She concluded her introductory remarks by welcoming the Inagurator cum Key note speaker and the chairperson of the session. TheInaugurator and Key note speaker of the evening was Dr. DevenderKawday Sir-Deputy Adviser, NAAC, Bengaluru spoke on Higher Education System @ NEP who emphasized on 3QS that is quality initiatives, sustenance and enhancement in the field of education as India has the highest young population of 38.5 million of students – which is greater than the overall population of Australia and Canada therefore he underlines the NEP is the need of the hour to revamp the whole education system of India from K.G. to P.G.in order to make it more flexible and multidisciplinary , inclined towards research, outcomes orientated vocational and skills based and highly employable.Hence he underlined the NEP 2020 envisages India to be a Vishwa Guru empowering students, teachers and the institutions for the welfare of the society and the state .Lively question and answer session was held, followed by his discourse and the session was chaired by Dr.Kane Sir -Former-V.C.RTMNU, Nagpur who carefully marked the distinction between mass and class education and pointed that NEP is a march towards class education for the masses without compromising the quality of education and has the potential to open multiple avenues for the learners .He affirms that the NEP encourages heterogeneity thorough multidisciplinary approach .He concluded that NEP is a positive step towards a prosperous and progressive future for the session was compered by Dr.ShraddhaDeshpandeMa;amnation..The Asst.Prof.Dharampeth Science College,Nagpur.

The second Plenary session was held on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2021, it began with the introductory remarks of Dr.DhanrajShette Sir-Principal-Yashoda Girls' College of Arts and Commerce, Nagpurwho touched upon the three national education policies that came into being from 1968 and ultimately the advent of NEP 2020 .The eminent resource person of the session was Dr.AniruddhaDeshpande Sir-Former Principal and Educationist Par Excellence, Pune delivered his talk on Structural Changes in Higher Education who underscored the NEP 2020 is truly futuristic keeping in mind the global changes .It is holistic and integrated in nature .It aims to augment the gross enrolment ratio from 26.2% in 2020 to 50% by 2030. It focuses on the establishment of National Research Foundation of India and draws the attention towards the formation of Research Intensive Universities, Degree Granting colleges and Teaching Universities. He concluded that the NEP 2020 envisions to make cluster of colleges for bringing multidisciplinarity and to grantautonomy to the institutions. It was followed by question and answer session .The Master of Ceremonies of the session was Dr.LeenanChandani Ma'am-Asst.Prof.D.B.SindhuMahavidyalaya, Nagpur.

The third plenary session was held on 13<sup>th</sup> July 2021. The introductory remarks Dr.UshaSakure were made by Ma'am-Principal ManoharraoKamdi, Mahavidyalay, Nagpur who stressed on making changes in the Education system in order to mouldIndia as the equitable and vibrant hub for knowledge competing with global universities .The resource person of the session was Dr.ShirishChindhade-Sir-Former Principal & Member of Board of Trustees, AICP, Pune delivered the talk on Quality Parameters of International Ranking of Universities .He labeled education as the sunrise industry and emphasized that it needed to be changed with the requirements of the corporate industries. He underscored to make the Indian education system globally competent to open the large avenues of employability for the young learners .He guided that the research was bound to be transformed fromlab to land and paper to people.He outlined that NEP focused on access, equity and quality and liberating the Indian education system form the clutch of westernization and making it indigenous. The enlightening discourse spurred the Question and session .The proceedings of the evening were made answer by Dr.HumeraQuerishi Ma'am-Asst.Prof.AnnasahebGundewarCollege,Nagpur.

The introductory remarks by Dr.Dhanraj Shete Sir-Principal, Yashoda Girls' Arts and Commerce College, Nagpur marked the beginning of the fourth Plenary session held on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2021. He pointed out that QIP focused on various aspects, changes, challenges and recommendations in the NEP. Dr.VinayakShirgurkar Sir- the popular speaker, was the resource person of the evening .The former President and Chairman of Board of Trustees, AICP, Goa spoke on Global Practices in Liberal Arts Education . He began his talk by explaining that the NEP aimed to establish multidisciplinary universities for imparting interdisciplinary courses with the view to serve the requirements of a large number of students. He informed that the section 11.1 of the NEP stated that all branches of creative humanendeavours including mathematics, science, vocational subjects, and professional subjects should be considered Arts distinctintively of Indian origin. He made the distinction between the present education system and the multidisciplinary education and cleared that the former is general and the latter is integrating and synthesizing. He further threw light on the subtle distinction between-Intra-disciplinary, Cross – Disciplinary, Trans-Disciplinary and Multi- Disciplinary approaches of studies. He cited the example of the interdisciplinary courses being run in different universities in Indian and foreign universities in liberal Arts. The crux of his talk was that Liberal Arts in Education needs to be promoted .His discourse paved the way for discussion and deliberation. The rapporteur of the session was Ma'am- Asst.Prof.ManoharraoKamdi,Mahavidyalaya Dr.MeenakshiWasnik ,Nagpur.

The fifth plenary session of the QIP was held on 15<sup>th</sup> July 2021.Dr.Jyoti Patil ma'am -Principal Renuka College, Besa, Nagpur made the introductory remarks by giving a cue the old traditional Education System was completely altered by the British and the NEP is a long awaited document. It is comprehensive, global and directed towards local reforms. The eminent resource person of the session was Dr.Pankaj Mittal-Secretary General, AIU, Delhi who enlightened the digital participants on ABC: Giving Wings to the Students underscored that the NEP is students centric and multidisciplinary in its approach and application .She lucidly explained -Academic Bank of Credit where the students could earn their credits and withdraw their credits by taking the degrees. Academic Bank of Credit allowed learners to enter and exit at multiple levels and their credit would be secured. Shedetailed the concept of cloud universities, Credit based system and flipclassroom .She concluded her talk on the note the ultimate motto of NEP 2020 is to make the students thelifelonglearners. It led to interactive question and answer session .The session was compered by Dr.Renuka Roy-Associate Prof-Porwal College Kamptee.

On the eve of 16<sup>th</sup> July 2021, the sixth plenary session was conducted; the introductory address made byDr. UshaSakure Ma'am Principal, was ManoharraoKamdiMahavidyalaya,Nagpur who highlighted that to bring change in the attitude of the students was vital and that could be attained only through mentoring system that was well defined in the NEP 2020.She also pointed out to empower teaching fraternity, bringing more transparency and accountability various plans and proposals were chalked out in the NEP. The distinguished resource person of the evening was Dr. SunitaWadikar Ma'am, Former Principal & Educational Consultant, Mumbai delivered her talk on "From Teaching to Mentoring: Implementing NEP 2020 stressed on quality that should be aligned to smart teaching learning synchronized with Industrial revolution 4.0.She stressed that the present learners were digital natives and the teachers were digital immigrants and the teachers must become techno savvy to cope with the digital natives .She highlighted the that the drastic changed the occurred in Education process was teaching learning to learners learning and the role of the teachers were of facilitators to stimulate active learning.She outlined the effective pedagogy keeping in mind the revised Bloom's Taxonomy .She emphasized that the teachers need to use various digital tools for engaging and effective learning. She focused on the activity designed by the teachers needs to be outcome based .She explained the NEP 2020 marked the components of life skills that need to be imbibed in the young learners to make them globally competent students. The epicenter of the whole exercise lay on teachers so they should not be involved in administrative and clerical work. It was followed by interactive session of question and answer. Dr. Deepti Jain Thakre Ma'am, Asst. Prof., Anjuman College, Nagpur was the master of ceremonies of the evening.






