**ADMISSIONS AND EXAMINATIONS LEADING TO THE AWARD OF THE
CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA OR DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF ARTS (MAJOR) WITH
HONORS /RESEARCH, DIRECTION, 2024**

Whereas, the Maharashtra Public Universities Act, 2016 (VI of 2017) (hereinafter the “Act”) has been made applicable to the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University (herein after the “University”) w.e.f. 1st March 2017;

AND

Whereas, the University has issued Direction No.27 of 2022 dealing with the composition of the four faculties created by the Act;

AND

Whereas, the Board of Studies in various subjects in Humanities in their meetings held on 27/2/24 has prepared the scheme of examination and recommended for Four Year Bachelor of Arts with multiple Entry and Exis options as per the NEP 2020;

AND

Whereas, the faculty of Humanities in its meeting held 16/3/2024 vide item No.2D has considered, accepted and recommended to Academic Council;

AND

Whereas, the Academic Council in its meeting held on 22/4/24 vide item no. 2D has and held on 22/4/24 vide item no.9 has considered, accepted and recommended to Management Council, for Bachelor of Arts (Major) in the Faculty of Humanities syllabi with draft direction and the Scheme of examination of Semester-I to VIII;

Whereas, Direction No.46 of 2023, governing B.A. program till date has been lapsed;

AND

Whereas, National Education policy 2020 is required to be implemented in the faculty of Humanities for under graduate programmes with multiple Entry and Exit options’

AND

Whereas, Government of Maharashtra has issued G.R.s dated 20.4.2023. And 16.5.2023 in order to implement the provisions of NEP 2020;

AND

Whereas, as per the provisions of section 73 (1) of the Act an Ordinance is required to be made for laying down the conditions under which students can be admitted to any course of study leading to the award of degrees, diplomas, certificates, and other academic distinctions;

AND

Whereas, making of an Ordinance is a time consuming process and there was urgency in introducing the degree course of “ Bachelor of Arts (Major)” in the faculty of Arts necessitating issuance of a Direction by the Vice-Chancellor, in exercise of his powers under section 12(8) of the Act;

Now, therefore, I, Dr. Subhash R. Chaudhari, Vice-Chancellor Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj University Nagpur, in exercise of my powers under section 12 (8) of the Act, do hereby issue the following Directions:

1. This Direction may be called "Admissions and Examinations leading to the award of Certificate, Diploma or Degree of BACHELOR OF ARTS (Major) with Honors / Research, Direction 2024.
2. This direction shall come into force from the academic session 2024-25.
3. INTERPRETATION CLAUSE: In this direction, unless the context requires otherwise the words, phrases and abbreviations used shall have the following meaning:
 - a. "AEC" means the Ability Enhancement Courses.
 - b. "Academic Council" means the Academic Council of the R. T. M. Nagpur University, Nagpur.
 - c. "ATKT" means Allowed to Keep the Term in higher semester.
 - d. "Board of Studies" means Board of Studies for various programs of Arts in the Faculty of Humanities in the University.
 - e. "CC" means Co-curricular Courses.
 - f. "CIE" means Continuous Internal Evaluation which refers to the internal assessment of students conducted at the college concerned.
 - g. "Competent Authority" (for admission purpose) means an "Authority" established or assigned the duty to regulate admissions in the course by the Government of Maharashtra or an authority constituted by the University, for this purpose.
 - h. "Course" means a paper/subject (theory or practical) prescribed for any semester of the programme.
 - i. "Credit" (C) for a course is dependent on the number of hours of instruction per week in that course, and is obtained by using a multiplier of one (1) for theory and a multiplier of half (1/2) for practical (laboratory) hour.
 - j. "Credit Points" refer to the product of no. of credits multiplied by the Grade Point for a given course/paper.
 - k. "Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)" refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all semesters.
 - l. "Degree" means the Under Graduate Degree awarded after successful completion of the programme governed by this Direction.

- m. "Fees" means the fees prescribed by the University/Shikshan Shulka Samiti of Government of Maharashtra for the Under Graduate programme under this Direction, from time to time.
- n. "Grade Letter" is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course (Paper). It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. Grade letters are O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P, F and AB.
- o. "Grade Point" is the weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the range of marks awarded in a course/paper.
- p. "Graduate programme" means Bachelors' degree programme in Arts.
- q. "MOOC" means Massive Open Online Course offered by SWAYAM/NPTEL or any other recognized University or Institution.
- r. "SEC" means Skill Enhancement Courses.
- s. "SEE" means semester end examination.
- t. "Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)" refers to the performance of the student in a given semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.
- u. "Student" means student admitted to Bachelor's Degree Programme in Arts under this direction.
- v. "ODL" means Open and Distance Learning.
- w. "OE" means Open Elective Courses.
- x. "University" means The Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University.
- y. "VSC" means the Vocational Skill Courses.
4. Details of eligibility for B.A. semester- 1 examination
- a) For the B.A. 1st Semester, Examinee shall have Passed the 12th Standard Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education/CBSE/ICSE, in the faculty of Arts or faculty of Commerce or Faculty of Science, vocational stream, professional courses or an examination recognised as equivalent thereto in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed.

OR

- b) 12th Standard Examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in Vocational Stream with one language only; OR any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto; in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed Minimum Competition vocation course (MCVC).

OR

- c) Any other Equivalent Examination of any State in (10+2) pattern with any combination of subjects.

5. Duration of the Program, student progression path and provisions for Multiple Entry and Exit

Duration of the B.A. Program shall be FOUR years (EIGHT Semesters) with the provision for multiple exits as mentioned here:

- (1) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 1st Semester Examination,
- 2) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 2nd Semester Examination,
- (3) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 3rd Semester Examination,
- (4) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 4th Semester Examination,
- (5) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 5th Semester Examination,
- (6) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 6th Semester Examination,
- (7) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 7th Semester Examination and
- (8) The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) – 8th Semester Examination

6. Student Progression Path and Provisions for Multiple Entry and Exit

The Students will have the flexibility to enter a program in odd semesters and exit a program after the successful completion of even semester as per their future career needs:

- a. A student can exit the program after successful completion of semesters I & II having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination and additional 'NSQF* Course or Internship' with 4 credits. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'Certificate in Arts' by the University. OR a student can continue the program in 2nd year.
- b. A student can exit the program after successful completion of semesters I, II, III, & IV having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination and additional 'NSQF* Course or Internship' with 4 credits. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'Diploma in Arts' by the University. OR a student can continue the program in 3rd year.

- c. A student can exit the program after successful completion of semesters I, II, III, IV, V & VI having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination. Such a student shall be eligible for the award of 'Three Year Bachelor of Arts' degree by the University. OR a student can continue the program in 4th year for either HONOURS or RESEARCH degree.
- d. A student, on successful completion of all the 8 semesters and having earned requisite number of credits as mentioned in the scheme of examination shall be eligible for the award of either 'Bachelor of Arts (Honours) Degree with Major and Minor' OR 'Bachelor of Arts (Research) Degree with Major and Minor'.

7. Re-entry or Lateral Entry

- a. Students opting for exit at any level, will have the option to re-enter the programme from where they had left off, in the same or in a different higher education institution within THREE years of exit and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of SEVEN years from the date of admission to first year.

- b. Re-entry at various levels for lateral entrants in academic programmes shall be based on the earned and valid credits as deposited and accumulated in the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) through Registered Higher Education Institutions (RHEI) and proficiency test records.
- c. Lateral entry into the programme of study leading to the UG Diploma / Three Year UG Degree / Four Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours/Research will be based on the validation of prior learning outcomes achieved and subject to availability of seats based on intake capacity.
8. The examinations specified in clause 5 above shall be held twice a year at such places and on such dates as may be fixed by the University.
9. A collegiate student shall have pursued a regular course of study for not less than 90 days in a semester of the academic session before being examined for any semester examination of B. A. in any recognized institution and/or college affiliated to Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University where the B.A. programme is conducted.
10. Without prejudice to the other provisions of Ordinance No. 6 relating to the Examinations in general, the provisions of paragraphs 5, 7, 8, 10, 26 and 31 of the said Ordinance shall apply to every collegiate candidate.
11. The fees for the examination shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time and whenever any change is made in the fees prescribed for any examination that shall be notified through a notification for information of the examinees concerned.
12. **Types of Courses**

A student admitted to this program is required to undergo and successfully complete the following types of courses as mentioned in the scheme of examination:

1.	Major Subject (Core) (Refer Table 3, Clause 13)	A student is required to select a 'MAJOR' subject from any one group amongst the groups provided in Table 3 under Clause 13 , provided in this scheme of examination in the 1 st semester. The last date for selection of 'Major' subject may be decided by the college but it shall not be later than 15 days after commencement of classes for 1 st Semester. Change of major subject shall not be permitted after the examination form is submitted. This MAJOR subject will be continued for all semesters.
2.	Minor Subject (Refer Table 3,	A student is required to select any one 'MINOR' subject from any one group under Table No. 3 Clause 13 except the subject in the group of

	Clause 13)	MAJOR subject or any other degree program offered by the university in any other faculty at the time of admission to 2 nd Semester. Change of 'Minor' subject shall not be permitted after the examination form is submitted. Except MAJOR or Group of MAJOR all other subjects would be considered as MINOR. A student should continue the same 'Minor' in all semesters throughout the programme.(Annexure-II)
3.	Open Elective Course (OE)	<p>A student is required to select an 'OPEN ELECTIVE 'COURSE'' from the 'Open Elective Basket' of any program offered by the university from any faculty before filling the examination form for the semester concerned. Such an 'OPEN ELECTIVE COURSE'' cannot be selected from the subjects chosen by a student as 'Major' or 'Minor' subjects. (Annexure-III)</p> <p>OR</p> <p>A student can also earn credits for 'OPEN ELECTIVE COURSE'' by successfully completing online courses of equivalent credits from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platforms.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>From other Higher Education Institutions affiliated to RTM Nagpur University.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Any other institute of National repute i.e. IIT, IIM, IISC, IIIT, and NIT.</p> <p>However, this need to be informed by the student to the university through the college before the commencement of the semester and an application for transfer of credits is required to be made by the student.</p> <p>If a student completes an 'OPEN ELECTIVE COURSE' from other faculty or online learning platform having more than 2 or 4 credits, it will be considered equivalent to 2 or 4 credits only</p>
4.	Vocational Skill Course (VSC)	A student is required to successfully complete the ' VOCATIONAL SKILL COURSE' ' as mentioned in this scheme of examination. This course must be a course corresponding to the ' MAJOR' ' selected by a student. (Annexure-VIII)
5.	Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)	<p>A student is required to select a 'SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE'' from the basket provided by the university for this purpose. (Annexure-IV)</p> <p>OR</p> <p>A student can also earn credits for 'SKILL</p>

		ENHANCEMENT COURSE by successfully completing online courses of equivalent credits from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platforms or from other Higher Education Institutions affiliated to RTM Nagpur University provided they are approved by the competent authority of RTM Nagpur University or the courses from 'Sector Skill Council.' However, this need to be informed by student to the University through the college before the commencement of the semester and an application for transfer of credits is required to be made by student. If a students completes 'SEC' from other faculty or online learning platforms having more than 2 credits, it will be considered equivalent to 2 credits in this programme.
6.	Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete the ' ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSE ' as mentioned in this scheme of examination.
7.	Indian Knowledge System Course (IKS)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete the ' INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM COURSE ' as mentioned in this scheme of examination. This course must be corresponding to the ' MAJOR.(Annexure-VI)
8.	Value Education Course (VEC)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete the ' VALUE EDUCATION COURSE ' as mentioned in this scheme of examination.(Annexure-IX)
9.	Co-Curricular Course (CC)	A student is required to select a ' Co-Curricular Course ' from amongst the basket provided under the direction/regulation governing B. A. Program. This course must be completed at the college where the student has taken admission and transfer of credit is not permissible for this type of course.(Annexure-V)
10.	Field Project (FP) /On Job Training (OJT)/Community Engagement Project (CEP)/Research Project (RP)	A student is required to undergo and successfully complete this course as mentioned in the scheme of examination under the guidance of supervisor/mentor assigned by the college. This course must be corresponding to the ' MAJOR. ' This course must be completed at the college where the student has taken admission and transfer of credit is not permissible for this type of course.(Annexure-VII)

13. Availability 'Major' and 'Intake Capacity'

All colleges affiliated to the University for offering B. A. Program in the Faculty of Humanities shall adhere to the following:

A student is required to select one Major program (subject) from any one group. • A student is required to select one Minor from any one group except the group from which she/he has selected the Major program (subject). • Total intake capacity for the program as approved by the university shall remain the same and be divided amongst the 'Major' subjects allowed for that program. • The HEI may offer a particular 'Major' program based on the availability of teachers and students. • The HEI is not expected to force any student to opt for a particular program where a choice is provided in the scheme of examination. 			

14. Minor Subjects:

All colleges affiliated to the University for offering B.A. Program may offer **MINOR** subject from any one group given in Table No. 3 Clause 13 except the subject in the group of '**MAJOR**' subjects. It is mandatory for the students to choose only one '**MINOR**' subject which obviously will be other than the **MAJOR** subject or Group of **MAJOR** s/he has already chosen. Once the **MINOR** subject is chosen from the particular group, it is mandatory for the student to pursue all the subjects from the group of that **MINOR** throughout the program (all semesters). (Annexure-II)

- 15 All colleges affiliated to the University offering B.A. Program are required to put up a list of offering '**Major**' and '**Minor**' subjects on the Notice Board as well as on the website of the college to make students aware about the availability of subjects. Moreover, colleges are expected to define and display the 'Standard Operating Procedures' for their staff

members and students to facilitate the process of selecting 'Major' and 'Minor' subjects.

16. In pursuance with the National Education Policy 2020 and a Government Resolution No. NEP-2020/प्र.क्र.09/विशी-3/शिकाना dated 20th April 2023 issued by the Government of Maharashtra, the credit framework and Teaching and Examination scheme for B. A. Program shall be as mentioned in **Annexure – I**.

17. Teaching and Examination Scheme

A teaching and Examination Scheme (of eight semesters) for student admitted to B.A. Program is appended in Annexure-I. separate scheme wise be provided (subject-wise) of Practical subjects under faculty of Humanities.

18. Credit Specifications:

- a. Theory/Tutorial Courses: A minimum of 15 hours of teaching per credit is required in a semester.
- b. Laboratory/Performance Based Courses: For one credit a minimum of 30 hours in laboratory or Performance Based activities is required in a semester of the week. Performance based activities include Studio activities, Workshop based activities, internship, Apprenticeship, Field based learning, community engagement learning, etc.
- c. Each semester will consist of at least 15 weeks of Academic Work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days.

19. General Guidelines:

- a. A student will be eligible to the fourth year of four year with Research Degree only when she/he scores minimum 7.5 CGPA or 75% in three-year degree.
- b. For non-credit courses 'Satisfactory' or 'Unsatisfactory' shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of SGPA/CGPA.

20. Assessment

- a. The final total assessment of examinees is made in terms of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) and Semester End Examination (SEE) for each course/subject taken together.
- b. In case of Courses having more than 20 marks for CIE, a scheme of evaluation is appended with the detailed syllabus of the course.
- c. Expected classroom activities shall consist of the following: (a) Group Discussion (b) Seminars (c) Power Point Presentations (d) Elocution (e) Debate (f) Role Play (g) Case Studies (h) Educational

Games (i) Subject Quiz. The teacher is expected to undertake a minimum of four of the aforesaid activity.

- d. The CIE marks will be communicated to the University at the end of each semester, but before the semester end examinations / as instructed by the university. These marks will be considered for the declaration of the results.
- e. The record of internal marks, evaluation & results should be maintained for a period of three year by the respective institute/college for verification by the competent authority.

21. Standard of Passing

The scope of the subject, percentage of passing in Theory and Project and Internal Assessment will be governed as per following rules:

- (i) In order to pass the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Semester Examinations, an examinee shall obtain not less than 40 % (Grade 4) marks in each theory course/paper, taking CIE & SEE together. Whereas, for practical/performance-based examination an examinee shall obtain not less than 50 % (Grade 5) marks in each practical, taking CIE & SEE together.
- (ii) An examinee who is unsuccessful at the examination shall be eligible for admission to the subsequent examinations on payment of a fresh fee prescribed for the examination together with the conditions for admission to higher semester as per the ordinance in force from time to time.
- (iii) The candidate who pass all the semester examinations in the first attempt are eligible for ranks/University merit positions.
- (iv) The result of the candidates who have passed the semester-VIII examinations but not passed the lower semester examinations shall be declared as NCC (note completed lower semester examinations). Such candidates shall be eligible for the Degree only after successful completion of all the lower semester examinations.
- (v) The successful examinees at the B.A semester VIII examination shall be awarded division based on CGPA as follows:

7.5 and above	1 st division with distinction
6 to 7.49	1 st division
5 to 5.99	2 nd division

(VI) Provisions of **Ordinance No. 3 of 2007** relating to the award of Grace Marks for passing and examination, securing higher division / class and for securing distinction in subject(s) shall be applicable.

(VII) University guidelines and directions issued from time to time regarding Improvement of Results, Reassessment/Revaluation and Incentive Marks shall be applicable to B. A. Programme covered under this direction.

23. Computation of SGPA & CGPA:

- a. The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student (in all the courses taken by a student) and the sum of the number of credits of all courses undergone by a student, i. e in that semester.

$$SGPA (S_i) = \frac{\sum (C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the i^{th} course and

G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i^{th} course.

Illustration for SGPA

Thus, SGPA=124/20=6.20

- b. The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$$

where S_i is the SGPA of the i^{th} semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

27. Eligibility for Award of Degree and Nomenclature of the Degree:

- a. A Student who earns minimum 124 credits in not less than three years becomes eligible for the award of Bachelor of Arts (Major) with minor Degree
- b. A Student who earns minimum 164 credits in not less than four years become eligible for the award of Bachelor of Arts (Major) with minor Honors/Research Degree.
- c. The degree certificate shall have the mention of 'Major' and 'Minor' subject opted by the student during the program.

28. Provision for B.A. Students admitted under previous Directions:

Students admitted to B.A. Program under previous directions shall not be absorbed into the scheme of examination under this direction. Hence, the university shall continue to conduct these examinations for three years to provide opportunities to failure students of these programs. All failure students after these additional six attempts will be required to take admission to 1st year of B.A. Program as per this Direction.

29. Provision for Transfer of Credits

The B.A. program offered under this direction provides enhanced academic flexibility to students in terms of selecting the courses they want to learn. A student can opt for any course from any statutory/recognized University or a

MOOC from SWAYAM/NPTEL in lieu of a course mentioned in this scheme of examination as 'Open Elective' and 'Skill Enhancement Course'. The mechanism for transfer of credits earned through these courses to be adhered is mentioned here:

1. Every student is mandatorily required to create an ID on Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) and shall submit her/his ID to the college.
2. Any Course mentioned in this scheme of examination under 'Open Elective' and 'Skill Enhancement Course' can be opted out by a student for taking a MOOC from SWAYAM/NPTEL learning platform.
3. A student cannot opt out any course other than the courses mentioned as above.
4. If a student is willing to opt out any such course in a particular semester, he/she will have to select a course of equivalent or more credits available on such online learning platforms in that semester and proceed for registration for the same well before commencement of the designated semester. This is expected to ensure that the student will be able to submit the certificate in time.
5. Registration for the online course, submission of assignments, completion of course, submission of examination form and producing the Course Completion Certificate with marks/grade to college shall be the sole responsibility of the student.
6. A certificate of completion of such an ODL/Online course shall be submitted by the student to the University through college before end term evaluation of designated semester.
7. Such a certificate shall mandatorily have the number of credits, duration of the course and grades/marks obtained by the student and shall preferably have a QR code for verification.
8. The college shall submit the grades/marks obtained by the student to the University along with Internal Assessment marks for the concerned examination.
9. **Normalization of Marks:** There is a possibility that the composition of marks for ODL/ONLINE course may deviate from the composition of marks under this scheme of examination. In such a case the total marks (Proctored Examination + Assignments) obtained by a student in ODL/ONLINE course shall be proportionately converted by taking a basis of total maximum marks prescribed in this Scheme of Examination and such normalized marks be split (Theory, Practical and CIE) in the proportion as prescribed under this scheme of examination.

Such a student will be required to fill in the examination form in the consecutive attempt and submit the passing certificate in order to get his/her corrected result.
11. If a student has opted for an ODL/Online course in a particular semester and failed to submit the course completion certificate within prescribed time for whatsoever reason, then the result of a student for that semester shall be 'WITHELD' until he/she submits the course completion certificate with marks/grades to the university through college.

30. If any question of interpretation of any clause arises for this Direction & related annexure the same shall be referred to the Dean, Faculty of Humanities, whose decision in consultation with the Vice-Chancellor shall be final and binding on all concerned.
31. **Saving Clause:** The examination and teaching scheme mentioned in this direction shall not be made applicable to any student admitted to B.A. program before 2024-25 and such a student will be governed by the earlier respective direction governing B.A. program.

In view of implementation of this the University has restructured all undergraduate programs incorporating Co-Curricular courses (referred as CC henceforth in this document) in all UG programs to ensure the holistic development of learners. This document prescribes the guidelines and standard operating procedures (SOPs) for students, teachers, and principals to facilitate smooth functioning of the scheme in larger interest.

Scope:

These guidelines and SOPs shall come into effect from the academic session 2024-25 and shall be applicable for all undergraduate programs having Co-Curricular Courses (CC) as a part of its scheme of examination offered by the Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.

Definition of Co-Curricular Courses:

Co-Curricular courses are meant to bring social skills, intellectual skills, moral values, and character appeal in students. It refers to activities, programs, and learning experiences that compliment, in some way, what students are learning in the classroom – i.e. experiences that are connected to or mirror the academic curriculum. Co-Curricular courses are typically, but not always, defined by their separation from academic courses. Students enrolled for any UG program of the RTM Nagpur University will be allowed to opt for any of the following activities as a Co-Curricular Course:

CC Basket:

1. National Cadet Corps (NCC)
2. Extension Projects (**Sanskar, Unnati** and **Sahayog**) offered by the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur
3. National Service Scheme (NSS)
4. Games and Sports Activities
5. Cultural Activities

Note: A student will not be allowed opt any course outside this basket as a Co-Curricular Course

General Rules:

1. Each UG program has a component of CC in 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Semester. Each CC is a 2-credit practical and performance-based activity course and should have student engagement of minimum 60 hours (practice cum performance) in the corresponding semester.
2. Every college/institute affiliated to the RTM Nagpur University is required to designate a teacher as CC in-charge. It may also constitute a team of teachers for monitoring CC depending on the number of students.

3. A student is required to opt for any of the CC mentioned in the basket and inform the CC In-charge in the beginning of the semester (The college/institute shall devise a suitable student friendly mechanism to facilitate students to submit their choice/s).
4. A student may opt for one or more courses as CC in a semester. In this case, the credit will be awarded for the course in which the student had performed best. Moreover, a student will get 10 bonus marks for each additional CC activity he/she had opted for.
5. The CC In-charge or a team of teachers will be responsible for monitoring the attendance, participation, and performance of students in CC activity throughout the semester.
6. The CC In-charge or a team of teachers will also be responsible for objective evaluation of students based on their performance in CC activity.
7. The rubrics for objective evaluation mentioned in this document are required to be strictly followed by all the colleges/institutes and violation of the same in any manner may attract the disciplinary action against the person/s concerned.
8. Evaluation for CC is required to be completed before the commencement of the Session End Examination of the corresponding semester and the final marks (certified by the Principal) are required to be submitted to the university in a mode and manner as may be prescribed by the university from time to time.
9. The record of the CC activities and assessment shall be kept for review for 1 year and should be submitted to the University as and when called for or during the AAA review.
10. Since the NCC/NSS follows an annual calendar, the CC Marks as per below can be claimed under any ONE of the two semesters for the academic year depending upon the availability of full assessment data of the student. Thus NCC/NSS CC marks will be allotted during the CC falling in EVEN SEMESTERS. This also means that the NCC/NSS cadet must participate in any other activity from the basket i.e. from GAMES AND SPORTS or CULTURAL ACTIVITY or COURSES OFFERED BY DEPT. OF LIFELONG LEARNING AND EXTENSION simultaneously for claiming CC marks for a specific ODD semester.
11. NCC/NSS activities shall be conducted by the respective in-charges (NCC and NSS Officers) as per the activity calendar published by the respective offices.
12. The NCC/NSS officer must ensure that the students of NCC/NSS are also enrolled in other CC activities for claiming CC marks for a specific odd semester.
13. Ordinance No. 2 of 1996 is taken as base for this marking and it is modified suitably for student to get 100 Marks.
14. If a student fails to opt for a CC, his/her result for that semester shall be declared by marking 'ABSENT' against CC.
15. If a student opts a particular CC but fails to obtain minimum marks (50), he/she shall be declared 'FAIL' in CC. However, if such a student had opted for any other CC in the same semester, the provision of 'Bonus Marks' shall come into effect and the same should be taken into account.
16. If a student is declared 'FAIL' in CC, he/she can continue the same CC in the next semester to improve the performance.

Evaluation Rubrics for CC:

In order to attain objectivity and bring uniformity in evaluation of Co-Curricular Courses having different nature, the evaluation of performance of student needs to be quantified in marks having maximum 100 (Hundred) marks. The breakup of these maximum marks varies according to the CC and is elaborately explained hereunder:

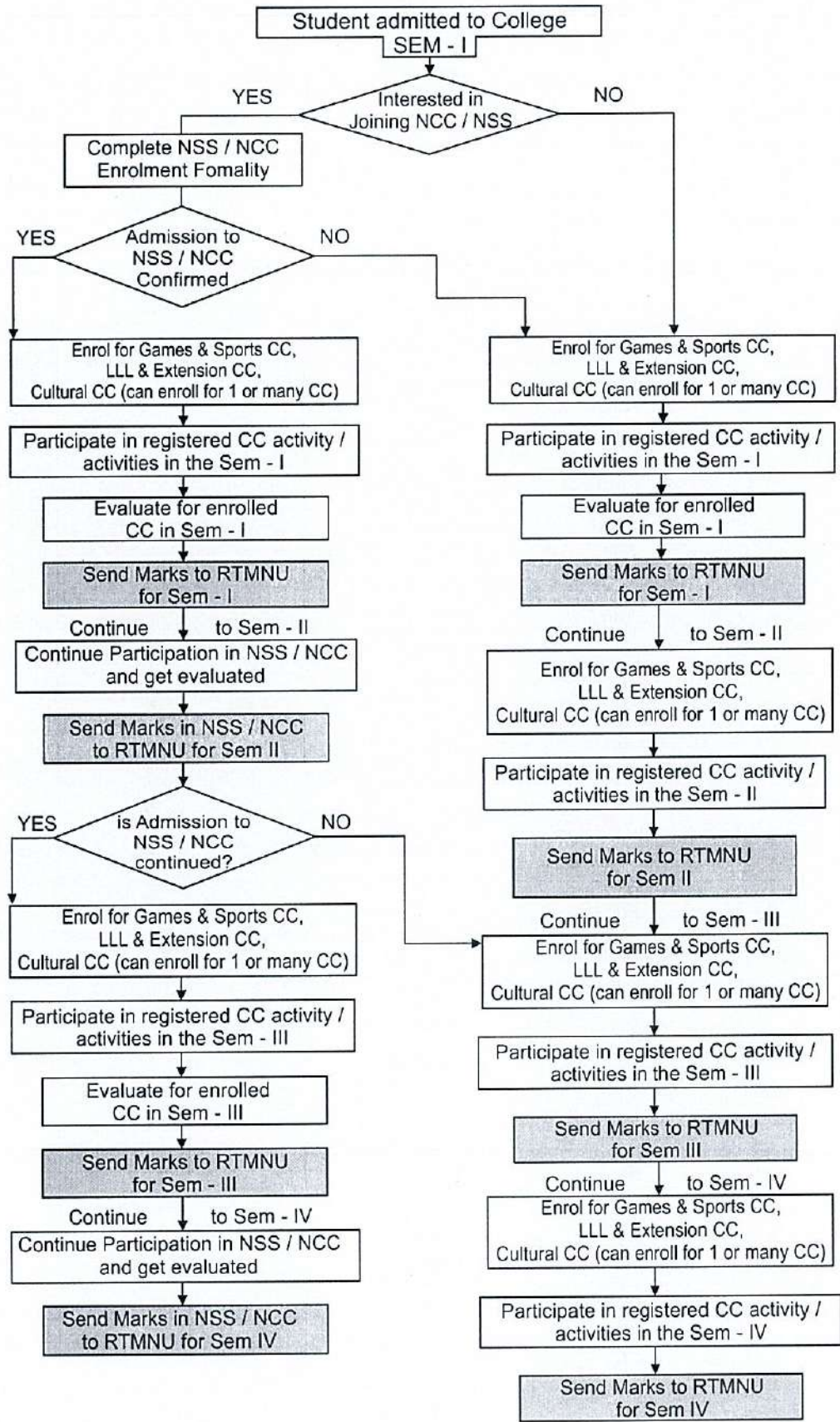
1. National Cadet Corps (NCC):

This course can only be opted by the students of a college/institute having NCC unit.

Rules for Extension Project:

- There are three types of extension projects viz. *Sanskar, Unnati and Sahyog* having 1 credit each.
- A student of any affiliated college can opt for a course under this category.
- A student opting for 'Extension Project' as CC must opt any two projects one of which mandatorily has to be '*Unnati.*'
- Details of the scope and other guidelines about these projects can be obtained from the official website of the Department.
- Attendance record for each extension project needs to be maintained separately and assessment for attendance to be made accordingly.

- In case of Team Sports, each team member will be evaluated independently and no assessment for team as such shall be made.

INTERNSHIP/APPRENTICESHIP**

1. Learning Outcomes

CO1	Student will be able to explain the profile of the institute/company/industry where the Field Project/ Community Engagement Project/Internship/Apprenticeship has been carried out. OR Student will be able to describe the need for objective of undertaking the field project.
CO2	The student will be able to assess its Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC). OR Student will be able to list the outcomes of the Field Project.
CO3	Student will be able to determine the challenges and future potential of Field Project/Internship. OR Student will be able to describe the profile of respondents / community involved in the 'Field Project' or 'Community Engagement Project'.
CO4	Student will be able to correlate theoretical classroom learning and its application in practical situations by accomplishing the tasks undertaken during Internship/Apprenticeship, Field Project, or Community Engagement Project.
CO5	Student will be able to apply various soft skills such as time management, positive attitude, and communication skills, scientific temperament during Internship/apprenticeship/FP/CEP.
CO6	Student will be able to suggest improvements in processes/systems based on his experiences during Internship/apprenticeship/FP/CEP.

2. Every student admitted to B.A. program is compulsorily required to undergo this course.
3. Each student will be required to submit a detailed report to the Department/ College/ Institute for the work undertaken during the respective semester **within 7 days of completion of the training** following which the evaluation and assessment for Internship/apprenticeship/FP/CEP will be done as per rubrics given by the college/institute concerned. The report submitted must be according to the Learning outcomes.
4. College/Institute is required to assign Supervisor/Mentor to students for Internship/apprenticeship/FP/CEP who will guide the students in attaining the outcomes of this course.
5. It is desirable to appoint an external examiner from the company/organization where a student has completed his internship/apprenticeship/FP/CEP. However, the Principal/HOD may appoint any other industry professional or subject expert as an external examiner. The remuneration, TA/DA or Conveyance Allowance to external examiner may be paid by the college/institute which will be reimbursed by the university as per established rules.
6. The Internal Examiner and External Examiner shall jointly evaluate the report submitted by the student and her/his seminar and shall immediately submit the evaluation report in the prescribed format provided in this annexure.
7. The College/Institute shall submit marks obtained by students to the university as per prevalent system within 3 days of evaluation.

[B] GUIDELINES FOR RESEARCH PROJECT

1. Learning Outcomes:

On completion of the research project, the learner will be able to –	
CO1	Formulate a research problem statement under a given state of conditions.
CO2	Carry out Review of Literature in the context of defined research problem and identify research gap.
CO3	Develop Constructs, design data collection, instruments and collect data using appropriate sampling technique and procedure.
CO4	Analyse data to arrive at meaningful findings and conclusions using appropriate statistical tools with reference to defined research problem.
CO5	Write a project report explaining research problem, hypotheses (if any), data collection, analysis of data, findings, conclusions, and recommendations
CO6	Defend the research design, methods, and findings in the Open Defence Examination

2. The research project is a compulsory course carrying 10 credits (7th Semester – 3 Credits and 8th Semester – 7 Credits) to become eligible for award of degree of Bachelor of Science or BCA (Research) under this scheme of examination.
3. The research project of a student should be corresponding to the 'Major Subject' selected by a student.
4. College/Institute is required to assign Supervisor to students for Research Project who will guide the students in attaining the outcomes of this course. One such supervisor can supervise maximum 20 students in a session.
5. Appointment of Supervisor: A supervisor shall be a full-time teacher working with the college/institute concerned. However, in case of non-availability of adequate number of full-time teachers, an ad-hoc or CHB teacher can be appointed as a supervisor. In certain cases, an industry professional or subject expert can also be appointed as a supervisor by the Principal of college. Supervisors shall not claim any additional remuneration/honorarium for guiding students.
6. Guidelines for Research Project:

- a. **Objective:** Every student admitted to Bachelor of Science or BCA (Research) will be assigned a project in 7th and 8th Semesters and it will be pursued by her/him under the supervision of an internal supervisor. The objective of the Project Work is to help the student develop her/his ability to apply multidisciplinary concepts, tools and techniques to solve organizational problems and/or to evolve new/innovative theoretical frame work.
- b. **Types of Projects:** The Project may take any one of the following forms (not limited to these):
 - i. **Review project:** A comprehensive review of literature based on a topic as assigned by the supervisor or selected by the student. This should include a detailed literature survey of about last 20 years (min. 50 research articles) related to the topic. This may lead to a good review article in journal.
 - ii. **Research project:** Experimental study based on the research topic leading to brief literature survey (min. 25 research articles), experimental section, results, discussion, conclusion and references.
 - iii. **Field study (Case study):** A field study or a case study on a topic selected. This may lead to analysis and results obtained by the students himself or the detailed analysis of the results reported in literature (min. 25 research articles/cases).



c. **Selection of Project Topic:**

- Project topic has to be selected with respect to the programme of study and area decided by the student.
- Topic of the project should clearly specify the objective and scope of the study. It should be specific and neither too vague nor centralistic. The topic should be designed meticulously. It can be designed like "Analysis of water quality index of industrial zone of MIDC Hingna: A comprehensive case study".
- Project selection has to be done in consultation with the supervisor who will act as a Project guide for the student. The Project Guide/Supervisor shall approve the topic and project synopsis in the initial phase of the project.

d. **Scope of Work:** The student is expected to carry out following activities in the project:

1. Prepare a synopsis and get it approved by the supervisor as assigned by the respective Institutes. **Approved synopsis shall be part of final report as appendix.**
2. Undertake a detailed literature survey (as given in clause 6 b) on the subject matter.
3. Carry out relevant experiments/data collection/observations.
4. Consult experts of the field.
5. Visit related organizations/institutions/industries.
6. Compile data in proper format.
7. Make proper conclusion/recommendations.
8. Prepare a Project Report.
9. The project-report should not exceed 100 pages.
10. Obtain approval of Project Report by project supervisor.
11. Submit a hard-bound copy of the Project Report at the Institute.
12. PowerPoint presentation at the time of examination based on his work.

e. **Submission of the Research Project Report:** Every student shall submit a hard copy of the Research Project Report duly signed by the her/him and supervisor to the college/institute one month prior to the date of the commencement of respective Examination. Following documents are required to be submitted with the Research Project Report:

- i. A certificate from the Supervisor to the effect that the candidate has satisfactorily completed the project work for not less than one semester and that the project is the result of the candidates own work and is of sufficiently high standard to warrant its presentation for examination
- ii. A declaration by the candidate that the project is the result of her/his own research work and the same has not been previously submitted to any examination of this University or any other University. The Project shall be liable to be rejected and /or cancelled if found otherwise.
- iii. A certificate obtained through anti-plagiarism software stating that the similarity index in the project work report is less than 20%; must be attached at the beginning of the project report or a certificate from the Supervisor to the effect that the candidate has not copied / plagiarised the contents of project report and that the supervisor has ensured the originality & authenticity of data /contents incorporated in the project report.

- f. **General Format of the Report:** The project report should preferably be written in the following format (The format may vary depending on the nature of research topic):
- i. Summary/Synopsis
 - ii. Introduction
 - iii. Materials and Methods / Experimental
 - iv. Results & Discussion
 - v. Conclusion and future scope
 - vi. Bibliography/ References
7. The College/Institute, on receipt of the report from student, shall schedule the open defence seminar by a student before the commencement of Semester End Examination.
 8. The open defence seminar (pre-submission) by a student shall be evaluated by the supervisor/mentor assigned to a student (as an internal examiner).
 9. **Appointment of External Examiner:** The External Examiner for evaluation of Research Project Report shall be appointed by the University through its established rules and procedures. The remuneration TA/DA or Conveyance Allowance to external examiner may be paid by the college/institute which will be reimbursed by the university as per established rules.
 10. The Internal Examiner and External Examiner shall jointly evaluate the report submitted by the student and her/his seminar and shall immediately submit the evaluation report in the prescribed format provided along with.
 11. The College/Institute shall submit marks obtained by students to the university as per prevalent system within 3 days of evaluation.
